Welcome from the Director of Alternative Provision





What's been happening during Terms 1 and 2

We have had a busy 2 terms with lots of opportunities for students.

<u>In term 1</u> we were lucky enough to visit Giffords Circus, where some of our younger students joined us from Rutherford, to watch the magical Laguna Bay production.

Students also welcomed the Narrative Alchemy onsite to perform two productions, "Chelsea's Story" and "Crashing" to raise awareness and empower young people in their relationships. Finally, we also received a visit from Gloucestershire Constabulary, Cyber Intelligence team to give the students guidance on internet safety.

In Term 2 our Y9 students went to visit the Careers Fair at Cheltenham where they were able to meet and speak with a variety of industries, gaining ideas for their future. They even managed to bring back some freebies! Students have been working with a local artist Marcus Walters, and Stroud Town Council to produce artwork that will be used to create an art installation on a local bus stop. This has been great for the students to feel that they are part of and giving something back to the local community. My vision for the new year is for students to take ownership of their learning, using the structure we've developed, and begin challenging staff to support their academic, skill-based and emotional growth.








What's been happening during Terms 1 and 2

Students at the Hub have started using personal journals at the beginning and end of each session to self-reflection. They have also provided with Individual Learning Plans (ILPs), which set personalised learning targets based on information Plans, Pupil **Passports** and assessments. In addition, students have engaged in PSHE activities during Black History Month and explored global Christmas traditions, including foods from around the world. They have also participated in restorative practices and developed practical skills, such as repairing damage caused during moments of dysregulation.

We all have been busy over the last two terms, our KS4 centres have visited Gloucester College and SGS in Stroud. The year 11's and some year 10s walked around the campus and saw each faculty area. Lots of our students were enthused by the Hair & Beauty, mechanics, electrical, plumbing and building courses. A group of Y11s chose to attend our 'raising aspirations' visit to Hartpury University, they were very impressed with the campus and what it had to offer. Maybe this will inspire one or two students to think about attending University in the future?

Young Gloucester came in and ran a workshop for all year 11s, the theme was all about building team relationships. This will come in very handy in the working world. Alan Clark (from the Department of Work and Pensions) continues to provide our students with a wealth of careers knowledge. Alan attends our KS4 centres and provides careers advice, college application support, CV writing and helps students complete the Future Skills Questionnaire.

I hold regular meetings about each of our Year 11s with all the colleges, Gloucester County Council and many other external agencies. We discuss future employment, destinations and any extra support we can offer. Following these conversations a Youth Worker with a careers specialism is attached to one of our students giving that extra help and support.

All our Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 centres attended a huge careers fair at Cheltenham racecourse, around 2500 students attended. There were many companies talking to our students and offering mini challenges and 'freebies'. All the local Colleges & Universities were represented and students talked to them about T-levels and Apprenticeships.

Apprenticeship Facts



- It's a job where you learn, gain experience, qualifications.
- You are an employee and are entitled to holiday leave and other benefits.
- You will complete part time studying for a qualification linked to the job.
- Minimum wage for an apprenticeship up to 17 is £6.40 per hour.
- Apprenticeships have entry criteria, you need grades in Maths and English before being able to start.
